

2027 Art Omi: Architecture, Spanish architects or Living and Working in Spain

About

The **Art Omi: Architecture** residency, through an agreement with Acción Cultural Española (ACE), invites one early- to mid-career architects to further develop their work during a two-week residency at Art Omi. The resident is selected through a competitive juried process and are invited to attend and participate, in a scenic setting in Columbia County, New York. Art Omi is located near the city of Hudson, about two hours north of New York City.

The architect will be provided with the following:

- Welcome letter for the visa process
- A return flight between their place of residence in Spain and New York (arranged by ACE)
- Private bedroom in shared living quarters
- Studio space with 24/7 access, Wi-Fi internet access, and basic tools for work
- Three catered meals a day
- A stipend of 300 dollars.
- The opportunity to share their work with a public audience at the end of the program, via an open studio event

The selected architect undertakes to:

- Manage and bear all costs associated with obtaining their entry visa for the United States, as well as any other documentation required for their admission to the country. This process must be initiated immediately upon being notified of their selection.

- Arrange and cover the cost of comprehensive health insurance for the entire duration of their residency.
- Adhere to Art Omi's Value Statement and Code of Conduct.
- Submit to ACE a final report on their residency, as well as three royalty-free photographs relating to their stay.

Eligibility

Application is open to Spanish architects or those who live and work in Spain that have been professionally active for at least the past five (5) years since professional licensing or obtaining an Master of Architecture degree in the U.S. or international equivalent. Applications will be accepted from early and mid-career architects in active professional practice or in academia with an architectural design teaching concentration. We do not accept applications from students currently enrolled in any B. Arch, M. Arch, or PhD program.

The Spanish architect's stay will coincide with that of the other nine residents of the Art Omi architecture programme, Space is very limited and a diverse and international group is sought, consistent with all Art Omi residency programs and aligning with the mission of the Art Omi: Architecture program. Architecture Residents are required to remain on campus during the entire two weeks.

Application Requirements

1. **Architect's Statement** (150 words max.), preferably in narrative form, about your work without any images or outside links. This is a fundamental document for our jury to fully understand your architectural practice.
2. A **Project Proposal** (5 pages max.) for the Architecture Residency describing the work that will be carried out while on campus during two weeks. See below for more information.
3. A **Portfolio** of your work (10 pages max.)
4. Your **Resume** and/or **Curriculum Vitae**.

Proposed Project

Applicants must submit and describe a project they wish to work on, on their own, while at Art Omi.

Projects of any scale may be conceptual or practical in nature, and may be an ongoing or existing project or a new design scheme to be initiated during the residency.

Projects may not be client-based nor directed.

While the campus and the dedicated Art Omi: Architecture grounds may serve as background inspiration or for documentation, projects cannot and will not be built on premises.

In all instances a presentation is required by the end of the residency. This may be in the form of drawings, models, collages, digital images, and the like.

While basic supplies will be provided, each resident is expected to bring their own design tools.
