The issues that embody this turning point and a different perspective into the near future are the need for sustainable construction, revitalized urban centres, a transition from policies based on the recycling and reuse of existing structures and resources, but also alternative strategies emerging among younger generations.

The exhibition of the 12th Spanish Architecture and Urbanism Biennial (BEAU XII) aims to display the awarded architecture of our time, highlighting the different stages of activity of each building through the point of view of their users and visitors. The exhibition offers a panoptical understanding of contemporary Spanish architecture, not just a compilation of individual audiovisual representations of every building; it can be read as an experiment in architectural communication through the use of CCTV (Closed Circuit Television), smartphones and digital screen capture images.
